STANDING ORDER FOR THE U.S. DISTRICT COURT
FOR THE DISTRICT OF NEW JERSEY

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following requirements shall apply in all cases in which Judge Choe-Groves sits by designation in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey:

Adoption of Local Standing Orders and Rules: Unless otherwise ordered by this Court, Judge Choe-Groves adopts the Local Rules of Civil Practice and Procedure of the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey, including Local Patent Rule 9.3.

Individual Rules and Preferences: After the filing of motions for summary judgment, Judge Choe-Groves requires a joint statement of undisputed material facts that reflects those facts on which the Parties agree. After the filing of Markman briefs, Judge Choe-Groves requires a joint claim construction chart that reflects the claim constructions on which the Parties disagree. Judge Choe-Groves will generally only construe a maximum of 10 claims in a patent litigation. The Judge does not permit the filing of summary judgment motions in ANDA patent cases. At the beginning of the litigation, Judge Choe-Groves prefers to set dates for the Markman hearing, pre-trial conference, and bench or jury trial.

Magistrate Judges: Discovery disputes and non-dispositive motions will be addressed by the assigned Magistrate Judge. The Parties shall continue to comply with status conferences and orders issued by the assigned Magistrate Judge.

Physical Copies of Filings: The Parties are not required to mail paper copies of documents to the Court unless requested.

Transcripts: For hearings and conferences held by videoconference, an audio recording from WebEx will be provided to the Parties. An AI-generated transcript will also be provided from WebEx at no cost to the Parties. If the Parties seek a live transcript prepared by a court reporter for videoconferences, the Parties should reach out to the court at least two days in advance via email to Steve Taronji, Case Manager for Judge Choe-Groves, at steve_taronji@cit.uscourts.gov or by phone at (212) 264-1611, and the Court will request a court reporter to be provided by the District Court for the District of New Jersey (subject to availability). For hearings held in person at the U.S. Court of International Trade in New York, New York, the court will not provide a court reporter, but an AI-generated transcript will be provided at no cost to the Parties. For hearings held in person at the U.S. Court of International Trade in New York, New York, the Parties may hire a court reporter at their own expense. In such a case, the Parties shall provide a copy of the transcript to the court.

Opportunities for Junior Lawyers: The Court encourages the Parties to create opportunities for junior lawyers to take a more active role in oral arguments, particularly those junior lawyers who are familiar with the issues and the record, but who are not as experienced in arguing before a court. The Parties are permitted to structure and divide presentations during oral proceedings to allow junior attorneys an opportunity to present arguments (including on a single issue) and respond to questioning by the Judge.
